- 3. If you have already begun work on this project, please explain what you have done so far.
- 4. Who is your intended audience for your project, and how do you intend to reach them?

Identifying your audience early on will help the Compass team develop effective strategies to communicate with them. It is also worth considering the scale of your audience, and how you will allocate resources in your project budget to reach them successfully.

5. Where will your project take place in Leeds?

If you are not local to Leeds and are unfamiliar with the city, please describe as best as you can the type of venue/site you envision your project taking place in.

6. How will your project address access barriers to arts & culture experiences?

Please explain how you plan to embed access in both the development and delivery of your project, and where possible, how Compass can support you in making your project more accessible.

7. How will you embed sustainable practice within the development of the project?

This might involve considering the carbon footprint of your project, the waste produced in the making of it, and how (if applicable) you plan to recycle or repurpose any materials after the festival.
